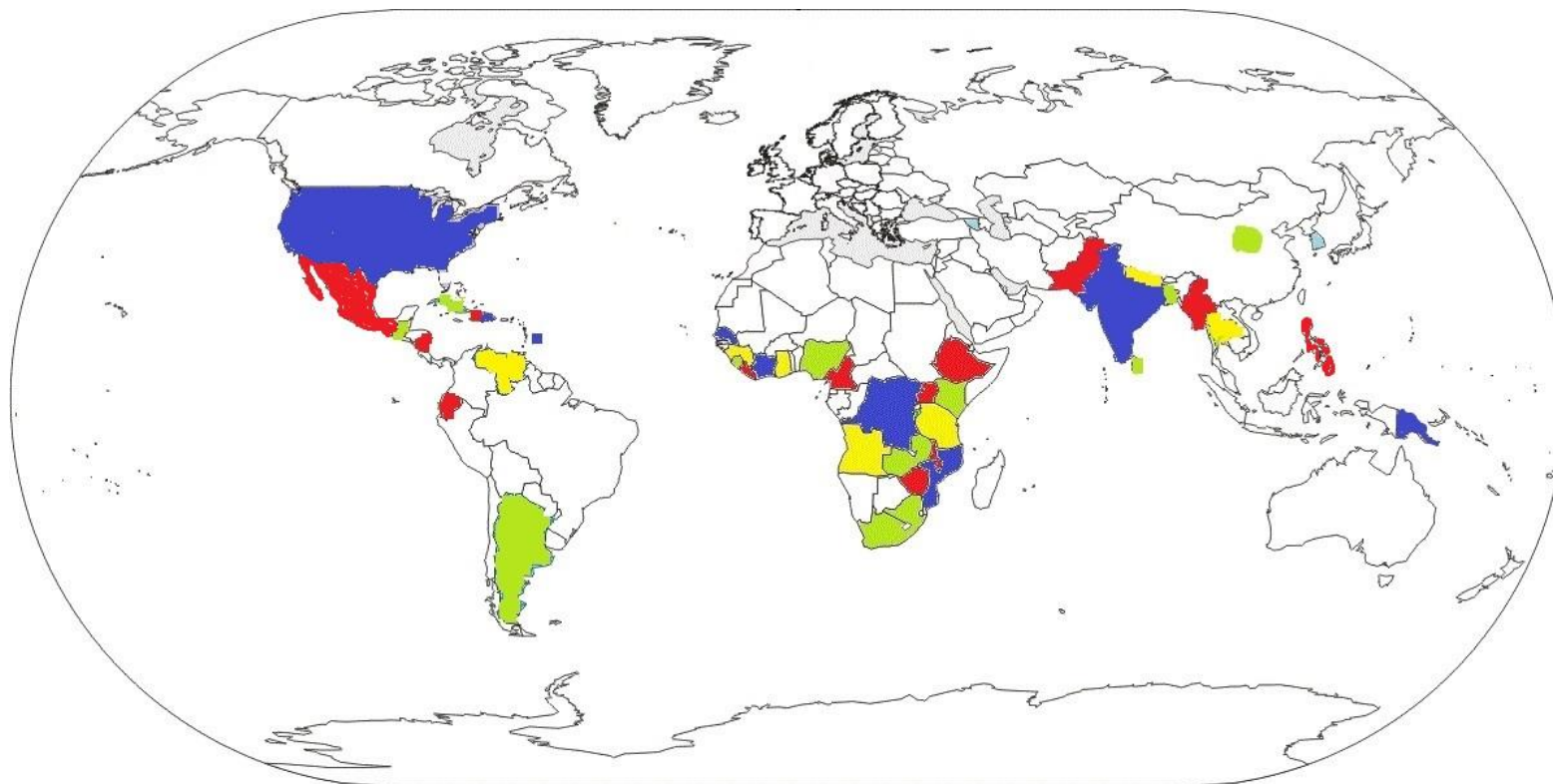

RADIANT LIVING

Jyoti is absolutely radiant. She speaks elegantly, holding herself with confidence and poise. She has an infectious laugh and loves to sing. You would not know by her big, beautiful smile that her husband and one-year old son died of AIDS ten years ago, and that she was left alone, infected with HIV. You would not know she was disowned by her family and forced to live in a shed 50 feet from her own house. You would not know she tried to escape her depression by attempting to commit suicide by drinking poison. Despite her challenging story, Jyoti is a role model and advocate for those affected by HIV/AIDS, and manages our village farm.

Jyoti enthusiastically recruited participants to meet our research team came. To help the women overcome their fear, she herself was tested; she became vulnerable by using her story to explain stigma and harmful misconceptions. The women listened intently, absorbing her words and trusting her.

How little people know about HIV in rural India. We will reach as many women as we can. We will test, educate, counsel and treat. Early diagnosis is so important for treatment and for the prevention of HIV transmission from Mother to Child. Education has the power to turn a life from shame and stigma towards dignity and fulfillment.

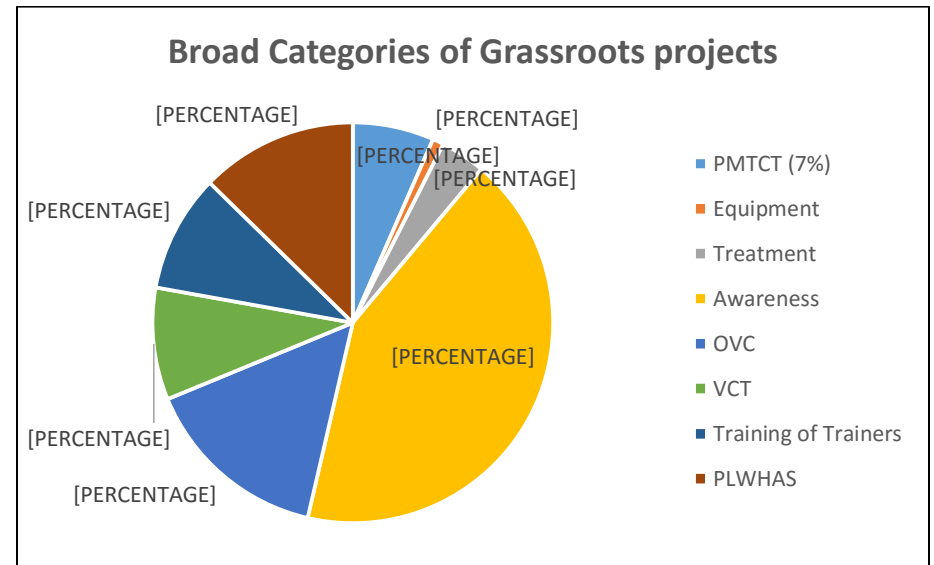

UMGAF was established at the 2004 General Conference to mobilize the denomination to help end HIV/AIDS in the world. The Executive Committee, representing a cross-section of the United Methodist Church, oversees the fund, builds HIV/AIDS awareness in Annual Conferences and churches, and raises money. The Global Health Unit of the General Board of Global Ministries manages the granting process.



UMGAF has funded 287 projects in 44 countries. We have focused on PEOPLE -- the general public, clergy, health professionals, teachers, community health workers, mothers, orphans and vulnerable children, widows, people living with HIV/AIDS, sex workers, truck drivers and congregations...Countless lives have been saved.
